

Operational Modifications to Mitigate the Spread of COVID-19

Based on Wisconsin's current April 24th Safer at Home Order, our 2020 camping season opens to Seasonal Campers on May 1 (as originally scheduled) and to Daily Campers on May 21st (slightly delayed from May 15th) leading into the Memorial Day Weekend.

As authorized by various Federal, State, and County orders and guidelines, you can visit as an overnight camper using your non-dependent camping unit (or a rental unit provided by us) that is equipped with its own bathroom, kitchen, and shower. No tent camping is allowed at this time, because our restroom facilities must remain closed to satisfy this order.

Furthermore, a campsite or rental unit occupant is limited only to members of a single household or living unit. All other private gatherings of any number of people at a campsite are prohibited. No outside daily visitors are allowed in the campground at this time. Feel free to walk and/or bike around the roads and elsewhere on the property as long as you are not in a group. We are blessed with fresh air and outdoor activities that can be enjoyed in a solitary or nearly-solitary manner. Remember, the outdoors is not cancelled!

Campers attending the campground need to maintain social distancing of six (6) feet with anyone outside of their household group. In addition, our Yogi Bear™ Theater, swimming pools and decks, Goodie Shop, playgrounds, restrooms, laundry facilities, and outdoor recreation activities (e.g., Arts & Crafts, themed weekend games, basketball, soccer, volleyball, etc.) are closed to avoid areas that encourage social gatherings of any number of people. Operations at our Ranger Station and Registration Area will be significantly modified to comply with required social gathering requirements.

While camping at our facility, we require that you follow the CDC, federal, state, and county guidelines during this national state of emergency. You must practice proper social distancing, hand hygiene, and cleaning to protect you and your family and our staff. You are the primary person responsible for your own preparedness. We cannot guarantee anyone's safety from any virus or sickness during a visit to Door County Jellystone Park™. This means you accept this risk for yourself and those visiting in your family. If you are sick, have medical vulnerabilities or are considered at higher risk, please postpone your visit.

When our other facilities are allowed to open and resume operations, we will implement frequent sanitization procedures following CDC guidelines to protect our guests and staff. The health and safety of our families and communities is priceless and non-negotiable.
